
EHTP is Partners with Alpha Kappa Alpha

Public Engagement Helps with Professional Develop ment

EHTP, partners with El Barrio's Operation Fightback (EBOF) for Work, Learn, & Grow (WLG) which offers young people ages 16 to 21 from



select public schools in New York City an opportunity to strengthen work readiness skills, explore careers, and receive academic support, including guidance on postsecondary education and the potential to earn college credit.

This year, we have 6 WLG interns who will be supporting our OST program at Patrick Henry, Scholars Elementary, and Robotics.

EHTP's OST Middle School Program Highlights

- OST SMID tripled DYCD Applicants last Fall, reflecting deepened ties with our families and community, launched our first EP "Candy Canes" with Music Production and our first network-wide Dance Team.
- Looking ahead: OST SMID launches a series of short films highlighting Classroom Management Challenges, Accountability and Anti-bullying.
- Our first loungewear collection to launch June '24.
- Our Dance Team prepares to compete statewide representing EHTP!
